REVIEW OF JANUARY

January was a busy month around the museum. Not only did staff and volunteers take down and pack away all the Christmas decorations, but also staff scurried to take down the exhibit, empty various showcases and move the art from the Corner Gallery, as a fresh new coat of paint was applied to various locations throughout the building. After the painting was finished, the installation of the museum's first exhibit of 2023 could begin. "What's Your Sign?" is an exhibition that brings flat signs to life, telling the stories of local people, businesses, and schools. All the signs are from the permanent collection and many have not been on display in quite some time. You are all cordially invited to the exhibition opening on Sunday, February 12th from 1 p.m. to 4 p.m. This will be the first Sunday afternoon exhibit opening that the Museum has hosted in over two years, so we hope that you all can attend and that you will help us spread the word by inviting your friends and neighbours. Light refreshments will be served in the Corner Gallery (program room) and admission for non-members is by donation. The exhibit runs until Sunday, May 7th.

In between all this activity, Jen also managed to install a new display on "Butter" in the original bathroom of Annandale House. On display are butter making equipment, butter paraphernalia, and an 1870s booklet on butter making from the museum's collection. We cannot believe it's not margarine!

The museum also hosted a group of museum staff from the Norfolk County Heritage & Culture Department. The group was given a tour of the site from top to bottom and expressed their envy of our compact storage systems in our wood and organic storage rooms. About half of those in the group had not visited our site before and they were suitably impressed by the facility and the role the community has played in its past and present.

"Salute to 70's Craft Workshop Series"



Artifact of the Month: The "Tillsonburg Shoe Factory Sign."

THE TILLSONBURG SHOE COMPANY

The **Tillsonburg Shoe Factory** was located on Broadway, in the general area of the north parking lot of the Town Centre Mall. The Shoe Factory began in 1913, when the Snedicore-Hathaway Company of Detroit set up a branch factory in Tillsonburg, known as the Tillsonburg Shoe Factory. The factory manufactured footwear of "a distinctively rugged and inexpensive character for men and boys." The company's founders viewed themselves as excellent "shoe man" and took great pains in selecting and training their workers. In 1919, the company purchased a Simcoe women's shoe company and added it to the factory's manufacturing program. In early October 1934, the company declared bankruptcy, leaving over five hundred people out of work. In February 1936, Scott-McHale (a London shoe manufacturer) purchased the Tillsonburg Shoe Company. They reopened the factory, but at a reduced rate and with a reduced staff. It was demolished in February 1963 to make way for an IGA Store.
