

For example, next time you are in the Front Hallway of the house, stand in front of E.D.'s picture and look up at the ceiling. The hands on the clock are pointing to 10:10. This practice dates back to the early days of watchmaking and was used to honour the time when Abraham Lincoln was assassinated in 1865. The hands of the clock were set to 10:10 as a symbol of respect and remembrance for the fallen American President. So amazing! At the Thursday luncheon, we also welcomed three of E.D. and Mary Ann's greatgreat grandchildren from the Toronto area. They were a wealth of knowledge, as well. THIS MAY

On **Saturday, May 11th at 1 p.m**., the Museum will be hosting our first ever **Mommy and Me Tea!** This event is open to anyone and everyone who is celebrating Mother's Day. We will be having a tea party and making a special craft to take home. Admission to this event is \$24.00 for a parent and child and \$5.00 for each additional child (taxes included). Pre-registration is required. Program registration closes May 8th.

As stated in last month's newsletter, on May 13th, our university summer students will be joining the team. Kathleen is EXTRA EXCITED to have Kenize and Larissa join her this summer! She is looking forward to having smiling, young, helpful faces in the Museum! Then in June, the"24 Summer Dream Team" will be completed when Lily Lee joins us. Lily is a Grade 11 student at Glendale High School. She will be joining us at the end of June and will be working in our Summer Camp program.

On Wednesday, May 15th, 2024, we will be celebrating the art of cross stitching with a Victorian Cross Stitch Workshop. We have an amazing local cross stitcher to lead our workshop. We will be learning how to cross stitch using a Victorian-inspired pattern. The workshop will be held from 6:30 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. at a cost of \$28.00 (taxes included). Kathleen has also started a program for home school groups in the area. Each month, local groups will be invited into the Museum to learn and explore. At the end of May is our last Lunch and Learn of the season. Entitled "Life by Lake Lisgar", local historian Joan Weston will be talking about the history of Lake Lisgar. Joan will be presenting on Thursday, April 23rd and Friday, May 24th. Lunch begins at 12 p.m. and costs \$35.75 (taxes included).
